A Time of Festivity




April in Luang Prabang

Elephant Procession

WAT MAI 7-7.30AM

The elephant procession begins at Wat Mai, a historic monastery of great significance to the people of Laos. For centuries, it has been a sacred site for the royal family and the residence of the Phra Sangkharat, the highest Buddhist dignitary in Laos.

The elephants will then proceed to Wat Xieng Thong, also known as the Golden Tree Monastery. Located at the confluence of the Mekong and Nam Khan rivers, this stunning temple is the symbolic gateway to Luang Prabang.

Together, these temples represent the spiritual and cultural heart of Laos, and the procession between them is a powerful symbol of the nation's rich history and enduring traditions.

OUTING GATE 5.30AM





Purifying Scrub & Wrap Ritual




Bath Enhancements
